

There are two shows there coming up in which may interest you; from Thursday 9th until Saturday 17th November a new play "Hireth", set in 1914. It's written by and starring Ed Rowe, *Mab Tregarrek*, and will be performed each evening plus two matinees. The play is supported by a cast of professional actors, and a local community choir with music adpated from songs by Seth Lakeman. Kovheans / In Memoriam

Albert Friedrich Georg Bock, *Bocka Du*, who died suddenly on Friday 17th August. He was made a bard in 2011 at Helston for services to the Cornish language. Albert lived in Vienna and was involved in the development of the Standard Written Form (SWF) of Cornish. He published a large number of books and other publications on the Cornish and Breton Languages. Our thoughts and prayers are with his wife Julia and their two children.

Also Chris Dunkerley, *Kevrenor*, has informed us of the sad passing of **Jean Harry**, *Jewann Pensans Ha Tramor* who died on Friday 24th August. Born in Penzance, Jean first went to New Zealand in 1973 but retained a strong love of Cornwall and all things Cornish. She and husband Graham then moved back to Cornwall for a while but then moved again for a while to Christchurch in the early 1980s. In 2009, Jean was awarded the Paul Smales medal in recognition of her work for the Cornish in New Zealand. She was made a bard in 2014 at Torpoint. A service to celebrate her life was held on Tuesday, 28th August at the Union Parish Trinity Church in Cambridge, New Zealand where Jean and Graham had been members of the choir and congregation since moving there in 2013. "A great loss for the Cornish in the land of the long white cloud."

We are also sad to report the passing of Jenifer Harris, *Gwenyver An Mor* who died on Monday 27th of August at Truro. Jenifer lived at Perranporth and was barded by examination in the Cornish language and continuing work for Cornwall. She worked as an assistant at Truro Public Library and for the British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) as well as Westward Televison and was a teacher at Trewirgie Junior School Redruth. Jenifer was barded at Perran Round, Goonhavern in 1970. Her funeral was held on Friday 14th September at Penmount Crematorium, Truro.

The family names, bardic names and year of bardship of all our fellow bards who have passed since our last ceremony in 2017 were respectfully read out by the (then) Deputy Grand Bard, *Melennek*, from the Men Omborth as part of the bardic ceremony at Newquay.
