## Gorsedh Kernow: Pewasow – Awards 2016

These awards are open to all adults

The aims of Gorsedh Kernow include "to maintain the national Celtic Spirit of Cornwall and to give expression to such spirit, to encourage the study of Cornish history, literature and the Cornish language, Kernewek".

Awards will be given to submissions which realise these aims and demonstrate exceptional endeavour or quality of work.

The areas covered by the awards are flexible and may overlap.

### 1. Yeth Kernewek – Cornish Language

A piece of work / project in any media making use of the Cornish language

(Title for poetry, prose or short story: "An venyn y'n kota melyn")

### 2. Rannyeth – Cornish Dialect

A piece of work / project in any media making use of Cornish Dialect

(Title for poetry, prose or short story: "The woman in the yellow coat")

### 3. Awenekter – Creativity

Creativity connecting with Cornish culture in any media

### 4. Studhyans Kernewek – Cornish Studies

An in-depth study relating to Cornwall and/or the Cornish People

### 5. Kemeneth – Community

Promoting Cornish identity and culture within the community

Some examples:

poetry, prose, short story, essay in Cornish  
recording of a song in Cornish

recording of a dialect story  
dialect prose, poetry, short story

film / theatre / drama  
art & design  
dance performance project  
performance, recording, or composition of a song or piece of music about Cornwall  
short story set in Cornwall,  
English verse on a Cornish subject

essay, article, paper, presentation

outstanding services to Cornwall and Cornish people  
services to Cornwall by someone living outside Cornwall  
the promotion of Cornwall beyond Cornwall  
outstanding Cornish achievement meriting international recognition
