Submissions must include:

- Name and contact details for nominee(s) (e.g. school)
 - Age group of nominee as of 31st Aug in year of entry:
(under 7 years), (8-11 years), (12-17 years)
 - Copy of work / project either as email attachment or hard copy to postal address
- or
- Description of project, including reasons for submission, with supporting evidence as email attachments or hard copy to postal address.

Text files (pdf or rtf), images and audio files up to 6Mb can be sent as email attachments.

Larger files (e.g. videos) should be stored in a personal cloud account (e.g. Dropbox) and then 'shared' via a link in an email to us or sent in the post on CD, DVD or memory stick. Media will not be returned, however. Please ensure you keep a copy of your work.

Awards Event

The awards will be presented at a special awards event during the Esedhvos week prior to the Gorsedh Ceremony in September. Award- winners' work will be shown and displayed during the event, together with selected performances. The Gorsedh also reserves the right to post award-winning material / hyper-links on the Gorsedh Website and Facebook.

Gorsedh Kernow: Pewasow Yowynkneth - Young People's Awards

These awards are open to all schools, young people's / children's organisations and individuals under 18 years of age.

The aims of Gorsedh Kernow include "to maintain the national Celtic Spirit of Cornwall and to give expression to such spirit, to encourage the study of Cornish history, literature and the Cornish language, Kernewek".

Awards will be given to submissions which realise these aims and demonstrate exceptional quality of work. The areas covered by the awards are flexible and may overlap. Account will be taken of the award nominee's age in three broad bands, under 7 years, 8 to 11 and 12 to 17.

Some examples:

1. Yeth Kernewek – Cornish Language

A piece of work / project making use of the Cornish language

- project to record and discover meanings of local Cornish place-names
- devising a school Cornish phrasebook
- recording a song in Cornish

2. Dons Kernewek – Cornish Dance

A performance / project using traditional Cornish Dance

- using traditional Cornish dances and costume as part of local history project
- choreographing a set of Cornish dances for public /video performance
- writing a new Cornish dance based on traditional moves and steps for video / public performance

3. Ilow Kernewek – Cornish Music

Performance, recording, or composition of a song or piece of music about Cornwall

- composing and recording a song in Cornish or about Cornwall
- composing and recording a piece of music inspired by Cornwall
- arranging traditional Cornish tunes for a performance / recording

4. Fylmow ha Gwarila Kernewek – Cornish Film and Drama

A performance project

- posting a you-tube short about why Cornwall is cool
- writing and performing / videoing a play about Cornwall
- recording a "radio play" about Cornwall

5. Studhyans Kernewek – Cornish Study

- personal history and memories of an older person
- essay or digital presentation on Cornish mining or costume
- essay or digital presentation about an important person in Cornish history

6. Art, Desin ha Diskwedhyans besyel Kernewek – Cornish Art, Design and digital media

- slide show of images illustrating a Cornish legend
- poster advertising a Cornish event
- illustrated booklet of why you love Cornwall
